Alfred University students to pay tribute to 9-11, armed forces

On Sunday, the 15th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks, Alfred University's Art Force Five invites the community to gather together at the campus' carillon bell tower to remember those who were killed, pay homage to those who sacrificed their lives, and honor those who helped in the aftermath. A chiming of bells, beginning at 8:45AM and repeating at 9:03AM, roughly 18 minutes apart will symbolize the times in which the hijacked planes crashed into the towers.

The short program will also feature a timeline of the tragic day, recital of poems and recognition of those students currently serving in the military. Attendees will have the opportunity to write thoughts, feelings, or reactions on paper and paste it directly on a two-dimension replica of the towers. Alfred University's ROTC student Quin Johnson and Political Science Club president Quintin Reed plan on hosting a screening of "102 Minutes That Changed America" later in the day at a location to be announced.

Observed and Imagined: Works on Paper by Mario Prisco

The Cohen Gallery will present recent figure drawings and fantastical watercolors by Alfred University Professor Emeritus and Dean Emeritus Mario Prisco from September 9 to October 16. For Prisco, observational drawing using the human form is a touchstone to his larger practice. His figurative work has always influenced essential decisions in his painting--the selection of objects, the relationship between parts, and the handling of edges. His series of watercolors displays fanciful and recurring motifs in imagined landscapes of bold colors and multiple perspectives. The distance he travels from the real to the surreal may seem extreme, but the artist would argue that the painterly skills and compositional connections between the two genres are implicit.

Mario Prisco was born in Brooklyn in 1930. After attending the High School for Music and Art in Manhattan, he went on to receive his BFA and MFA at Syracuse University. His teaching career included positions at Moore College of Art, where he established the Fine Arts Division, and the School of Art and Design at Alfred. Prisco has had a long and successful career at Alfred. Among his many accomplishments were the creation of the design program and the establishment of sophomore drawing. He continues to attend the Thursday night open studio on campus.

Buffy Turner, of Food Sovereignty is Tribal Sovereignty, will be the speaker at the first Women's and Gender Studies Roundtable of the year. The roundtable will be on Friday, September 9, from 12:20 - 1:10 p.m. in the Judson Leadership Center. The roundtables are free and open to the public. Buffy Turner's topic will be:

Minonjigewin: Women Warriors Leading Native Food Sovereignty & Resurgence

How do you feed yourself in the 524th year of genocide? How do Native women reclaim strength and leadership through providing sustenance? How do you grow new tribal food systems rooted in tradition? What's it like to take on the federal government, the oil industry and the patriarchy in order to put good food on the table? And don't "Manoomin with Prickly Pear Ruby Dressing" and "Coriander-Cured Bison Tenderloin with a Wild Chokecherry Sauce" sound like innovative cuisine to you?

For most people, the narrative of Native foods in North America begins with Thanksgiving and bottoms out with diabetes rates twice as high in NDN Country as in white America today, and 1 in 4 Native folks defined as food insecure. Come hear the rest of the story through the perspectives of Native women professors, land & water defenders, seedkeepers, chefs, "Junkfood Tax" champions, vice-presidential candidates, granddaughters of corn priestesses, fisherwomen, National Organic Standards board members, poets and more.

A selection of tribal foods will be served at the roundtable.
