## Greek community to conduct 'AU for Andy' fund-raiser 12/01/00

Bartholomew was critically injured in a fire at his apartment on South Main Street in Alfred just two days before he was scheduled to graduate from the University. Since then, however, Bartholomew has faced continuing medical hurdles, and has had to be hospitalized for additional surgeries and other treatments. He is also continuing physical therapy. Through the Inter Greek Council, members of Alfred University's fraternities and sororities will raise money to help the Bartholomew family with expenses relating to his treatment. The Inter Greek Council, members of Alfred University's fraternities and sororities, are working together on a dinner to be held at 7 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 7, in Susan Howell Hall, followed by an auction, to raise money to help the Bartholomew family defray some of the expenses arising from Andy's medical treatments. Among the items to be auctioned during the benefit are a \$200 ski package to Swain; a gift basket from Rosie O'Donnell: dinner for two at Coslos' Restaurant in Almond; and manual labor provided by the brothers of Kappa Psi Upsilon. Tickets for the benefit are \$5 per person and will be on sale from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. daily through Wednesday, Dec. 6, in Powell Campus Center on the AU campus.
