The camps are designed to give both experienced and inexperienced riders an opportunity to advance and define their personal riding goals. Campers are assigned a horse to ride during the week and provide hands-on care for. They may bring their own horse to camp. Nancy Kohler, director of the Alfred University Equestrian Program, will be the camp director this summer. She brings more than 30 years of training riders and horses to her role as camp director.
