

Two alumni join Alfred University Board of Trustees

Two Alfred University alumni have been named to the University's Board of Trustees. Elected to three-year terms on the board are alumni Stephen K. Heine '81 and Warren L. Smith '59. Heine graduated from the College of Business with a major in management and health care administration. He was active at Alfred by participating in men's lacrosse, the senior class gift committee, Student Senate, and was a brother of Delta Sigma Phi. He was honored as the Alfred University Outstanding Senior. Currently, he is executive vice president for consumer and business banking at Provident Bankshares Corp. in Baltimore, MD. Provident is now considered the largest commercial bank with \$6.4 billion in assets. Heine continues to be active after his Alfred years by serving on the boards with the Frederick County Chamber of Commerce, the American Red Cross in Frederick, and the Urban League in Ohio and New York. He is a past member of the Alfred University Board of Trustees, serving as an Alumni Elected Trustee 1995-98 and the School of Business Executive Advisory Council. Heine and his wife Carole have four children. He coaches girls' lacrosse at the youth and high school club levels in his hometown. Smith, originally from Westchester County, NY, earned his B.A. in economics from AU. As a Saxon, he was a member of Blue Key, president of Delta Sigma Phi, and treasurer of the Student Senate. Following graduation Smith took a job with American Can Co. in New York and was eventually transferred to Indiana. He played a role in marketing the first soft drink can. He later worked for Stokely-VanCamp Co. where he was a Gatorade product manager. He then took a position as the marketing director for the Indiana National Bank in Indianapolis where he worked for 21 years, retiring in 1996 as first vice president. He has since retired a second time as the manager of the strategic marketing group for The United Way of Central Indiana. An active alumnus, Smith is currently second vice president of the Alumni Council and has been a member of the Council for five years. He has been involved with class reunions as well, filling the role of reunion coordinator in 1999 and 2004. His civic and professional accomplishments and awards include Graduate Institute of Bank Marketing, the American Advertising Federation Silver Medal Award, and Advertising Manager in 1982 for the National Sports Festival of the Pan Am Games in 1984. He has also served 15 years to the Indianapolis Youth Hockey Association. Smith and his wife Judith have two children.
