"Follow Through" represents 11 years of careful planning and meticulous work by Adam Hinterlang and Peter Morgan coming to fruition. The exhibition contains individual works by both artists as well as

their collaborative tile pieces. The works of Ceramicist/Conceptual Artist, Peter Morgan, are an exploration of the world through the investigation of location, representation, perception, taxonomy, and language. In contrast, Adam Hinterlang's practice is rooted in mark making. He employs drawing, computer animation, and sound to create his unique biomorphic creations. What is most important to both artists is their collaborative project known as, "Wildlife Fashion Art."

"Wildlife Fashion Art" began in the summer of 2005 as a collaboration between the dynamic duo. With few obligations and plenty of free time, the two toiled away on this project, which was to be their "get rich quick scheme." The original principle was to take the most "fashionable" and "trendy" colors of the day and apply them to silhouetted images of animals in action poses. This project brought together the artists' interests in both animals and color theory, and though Anthropologie never licensed their work to create a line of purses (as they had hoped), it continues to spark their imagination.

The Division of Ceramic Art is pleased to present two visiting artists, Joshua Paul Hebbert and Pauliina Pllnen.

Hebbert's studio acts as a space for me to both escape and explore the world. By pulling on personal, social, and constructed symbols, I remove them from direct, cultured meaning. I weave them together to create a new fabric that is at once personal and universal. It serves as a critical look at the way knowledge is acculturated and understood. My work lends itself to circuitous mental exploration of vague understandings, tactile remembrances, and unknown systems of logic.

Pllnens work reflects transformation of physical space, interpreted through the medium of clay. Manual production is related to the anthropomorphic qualities of the sculpture and its physical potential, while the concept of a vessel is still present. Hand built positive and negative spaces reflect the shift from external to internal places, and something invisible, yet concrete, is embedded into these spaces in between.

Joshua Paul Hebbert is an artist living and working in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. After growing up in rural Western Nebraska, he attended Creighton University in Omaha and received his BFA in Ceramics. He recently graduated from the University of Colorado, Boulder with his Maters of Fine Arts. His work addresses his queer identity as well as systems of logic and communication. He is currently a Resident Artist at The Clay Studio in Philadelphia and is Adjunct Faculty at Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore. He has exhibited his work nationally and internationally.

Pauliina Pllnen was born and raised in Finland, and she received her BA in Ceramic and Glass Design from Kuopio Design Academy in Finland in 2006 and MA degree from the Oslo National Academy of Arts in Norway 2012 receiving both of the student awards.

She has exhibited internationally including the Design Museum in Finland, National Museum of Art, Architecture & Design in Norway, Estonian Museum of Applied Art and Design, Latelier dateliers dart de France in Paris and the European Ceramic Context 2014. She has been a resident artist at the The Clay Studio in Philadelphia, International Ceramic Research Center Guldagergaard in Denmark and the most recently at the Victoria & Albert Museum in London.
