Employees can easily sign up through their BannerWeb account to receive notice of campus weather closings, or to be notified of an emergency situation on campus.

You will be able to receive e-mail, voice mail, cell phone, TEXT and/or fax alert messages.

It is easy and quick to register through BannerWeb. All you need to have handy is your Banner ID# and PIN.

Then just click on Personal Information tab and fill out the quick survey listed under Emergency Alert Contact Info.

Fee: Students - \$7 to cover the cost of the face mask; the course is free to all faculty and staff.

If you already have a face mask, bring it to the session. You may also wish to bring a pillow or blanket to kneel on.

We are inviting volunteers to attend and become certified in adult and child CPR and AED use. If you have already taken the course, now is a good time to recertify and refresh your skills.

This program is designed to comply with enactment of the State's AED Legislation and to train University faculty, staff, and students in the skills of CPR and use of an AED.

This CPR/AED certification program has been approved by the NYS Department of Health. It is the equivalent to the American Red Cross and American Heart Association CPR/ AED programs.
