Istanbul 2012: Crossroads of Civilization

An information session on the 6-credit summer course, "Istanbul 2012: Crossroads of Civilization" will be held on Wednesday, October 12, at 5 p.m. in Olin 210.

The four-week course, which takes place just north of Istanbul on the Black Sea campus of Isik University, will take place between July 2 and July 27. Students will be accompanied by an Alfred faculty member who has worked with the faculty of Isik University to design the course. In addition to the 6 credits earned over the summer, students will earn another 2 credits for a spring class on Modern Turkey that precedes the summer travel to Turkey.

As ancient Constantinople, Istanbul was once the capital of the Roman Empire and the most powerful city in Europe. With one foot in Asia and one in Europe, modern Turkey is in many respects the center of today's world, and it plays a vital role in world politics. With its strong economy and democratic political culture, it is an important bridge to the Middle East for the democracies of the West. The summer course at Isik University offers students a wonderful opportunity to learn more about this beautiful and fascinating country and its cultural capital, Istanbul.

Students in the class will study the Byzantine Empire, Ottoman and early Republican Turkey; Politics and Culture of modern Turkey; the role of Turkey in world politics; and elementary Turkish language. One day a week will be reserved for guided site visits of places such as the Old City of Istanbul (including the Hagia Sofia, Blue Mosque, and Grand Bazaar), the Princes Islands, the Bosphorus, and the Dardanelles.

Community members may take the course in Turkey without taking the 2-credit spring course. The trip is open to all AU faculty, staff, students, and alumni.
