Bergren Forum: Frey and Fractals?

The Bergren Forum sponsored by the Division of Human Studies will be meeting at 12:10 PM on Thursday September 3rd in the Nevins Theatre, Powell Campus Center. Bring a brown bag lunch; coffee and tea are complimentary. Speaker: Addison Frey Topic: "Is it Live, or is it Fractal?" A geometric shape is self-similar if it can be split into parts, each of which is (at least approximately) a reduced-sized copy of the whole. A fractal has the additional property that it has an irregular structure at infinitely small scales. In nature objects such as clouds, smoke, mountain ranges, and lightning display approximate fractal characteristics. We will describe how to mathematically generate fractals to simulate natural objects and then compare some of these natural objects with mathematically generated fractals. Will we be able to tell which is which?

Mann's work is currently on exhibit in MAD in NYC (the Museum of Art and Design) and was featured in the Museum of Modern Art's "Design and the Elastic Mind" in 2008. He was recently awarded the prestigious Jerwood Prize.

Through synthesizing the temporal processes of movement, a recurrent theme throughout Mann's portfolio, he reconstructs pure sensation in objective terms through the notion 'motion engendering form' creating tangible objects of mysterious beauty.

Memorial Service scheduled for John Scott Weaver

We are saddened to learn of the death of J. Scott Weaver, retired professor of Geology at Alfred University, on Aug. 25, 2009.

Professor Weaver taught in the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences from 1984 until his retirement in 2004. He was recognized with a University excellence-in-teaching award, and was highly regarded for his work at the Stull Observatory.

Additionally, Professor Weaver was an active member of the A.E. Crandall Hook and Ladder Co., and is credited with persuading several current members of the faculty to also serve.

The family will hold a private gathering in the Adirondacks. A gathering of friends will take place at the A. E. Crandall fire hall in Alfred, NY at 4 p.m. September 19, 2009.
