Student Health Care Sessions at St. Jude's

If you need health insurance coverage, Fidelis Care and St. Jude's Chapel invite you to learn about available options at two upcoming health insurance information sessions.

A Fidelis Care representative will be available at St. Jude's Chapel, Lower College Drive on the Alfred State College campus, between 9 A.M. and noon on Friday, April 25 and Friday, May 2 to explain the products available through New York State of Health: The Official Health Plan Marketplace, as well as Medicaid, and Child Health Plus.

NY State of Health products are currently available to individuals and families who experience a qualifying event, such as the loss of current health insurance coverage. The general public will be able to apply for coverage through NY State of Health during the next open enrollment period, which begins on Nov. 15.

Eligible residents may apply for coverage through Medicaid and Child Health Plus year round. Benefits are comprehensive. Almost every child under age 19 in New York is eligible for coverage through Child Health Plus. There may be a modest premium, depending on household income.
