17th Perkins lecture: Sequoia Miller

Sequoia Miller: Wet Clay, Pottery and the Museum as a Forum

The Alfred Ceramic Art Museum established the Dorothy Wilson Perkins Ceramic History Lecture Series in 1998, thanks to a generous endowment gift to the Museum by Dr. Lyle Perkins (BFA Alfred '39; MFA Alfred '47) in memory of his wife, Dr. Dorothy Wilson Perkins (BFA Alfred '39).

Sequoia Miller is a historian, curator, and studio potter. He is the Chief Curator at the Gardiner Museum of Ceramic Art, Toronto, Canada. Miller received a BA in Russian and Art History from Brandeis University and a MA from the Bard Graduate Center for Decorative Arts, Design History, and Material Culture in New York City. Miller received his doctorate in the History of Art from Yale University. His thesis analyzed the connections between ceramics and conceptual art practices on the East and West Coasts of the United States in the 1960s and 1970s. Miller curated The Ceramic Presence in Modern Art at the Yale University Art Gallery and authored the accompanying award-winning catalogue. His research also includes sixteenth and seventeenth century German stoneware, English salt-glazed stoneware, and Queen Mary's monumental delftware.

Before reentering academia, Miller was a full-time studio potter for over ten years. Based in the Pacific Northwest, he made one-of-a-kind functional pots for daily use in domestic environments. Miller has exhibited widely and led workshops at craft schools, universities, and art centers.

HR Tip of the Month

Did you know that as an employee of Alfred University you may qualify for Public Service Loan Forgiveness?

Qualifying Factors:

- -Must work at least 30 hours a week
- -Your federal loans have to be Direct Loans to qualify
- -Your loans must be paid under an income based repayment plan
- -Have to make 120 on-time qualifying payments then the rest of your loans are forgiven
- -Complete and submit the Employment Certification for Public Service Loan Forgiveness form yearly to your loan servicer to certify your employment
- -Human Resources can certify your employment and verify employment dates

Mugs with Math is a free monthly event with an activity involving math and other applications. Bring your own mug and fill it with free hot chocolate that is a standard at these events! This month we are pleased to have a dance workshop led by Colleen Wahl and supported by the Math Club and Dance Department. Here's the fascinating plan Colleen has in store for us:

This workshop dives into movement scales that progress through points and along the internal structures of the icosahedron. The idea scales that move the body through spatial patterns, much like a musician who plays scales, was first developed by Rudolf von Laban. His ideas have since grown into a larger study known as Space Harmony, in which platonic solids provide the basis of numerous movement scales. Each scale challenges the body in different ways, revealing new patterns through space and relationships to the spatial world in which we live. Be prepared to explore the icosahedron through movement and learn about new patterns and ways to understand both movement and the 20-sided form.

Save the date September 27th, 3:30-5pm starting in Miller 210 (classroom) and moving up to Miller 301 (dance studio) at about 4 pm.

TSI / Harland Snodgrass Media Gallery for the week of October 1-7 will feature WIP The Sin Park by recent institute for Electronic Arts, NYSCA - Electronic Media & Film, Artist in Residence, Chen Wang. Wang uses a number of technologies in her media-art work including painting, 3D modeling, costume/sculpture fabrication, video and performance.
