New [EXTERNAL] email subject may help discern fraudulent emails

With the increase in Internet scams in recent years, many of you have seen the attempts of scammers impersonating key University employees. For example, scammers impersonated President Zupan. You also may have seen emails that appear to be from the ITS Helpdesk, but are not. Some of these scams are poorly executed (and even humorous), while some of them can be rather sophisticated and convincing.

ITS will introduce an additional tool to help campus community members identify email spoofing. More specifically, we will be identifying any emails from non-Alfred University email addresses with the designation [External] in the subject line. As an example, if an outside scammer sent an email appearing to come from Mark Zupan, with the subject [EXTERNAL], you would know that this is a scam since President Zupan is one of our own...and NOT external. Please also know that legitimate emails sent from external sources will also display the [EXTERNAL] subject tag.

We are piloting this right now with ITS and the Executive Team. It is relatively unobtrusive, and provides an additional marker to identify the authority of the sender. Starting in early February, we will push this out to the wider campus. If any campus user wants to start using this immediately, please contact the ITS Helpdesk.

An additional note regarding social engineering attacks and Online scams: All University employees are required to take the Unified Educators training offered through Human Resources at: https://learn.ue.org/Logi...

Given the persistent information security threats, I would further encourage all employees to view the information regarding Data Security: Phishing, Malware, and Passwords in the training modules. If you have any problems logging into the tutorials, you can contact Kayleigh Misner in the HR Office.

HR Tip of the Month

Did you know that you can receive your W2 (the form that reports an employee's annual wages and the amount of taxes withheld from his or her paycheck) electronically in BannerWeb? This feature will be available mid-January.

Advantages of receiving Form W-2 electronically

Your W-2 will be available sooner than a printed copy

You can reprint a copy of your W-2 anytime during the year

No possibility that a Form W-2 might be lost, stolen, delayed or misplaced by the U.S. mail service or by the employee

Multiple levels of security protects all information within the BannerWeb system Access can be obtained anytime via the internet-anywhere in the world

If you do not choose to receive your W-2 electronically, a paper copy will be mailed to your home

address (current students receive your W-2 electronically, a paper copy will be mailed to your nome address (current students receive their W-2 in their campus box). Faculty and staff, please ensure the Office of Human Resources has your up-to-date mailing address.
