

Alfred University plans Sept. 11 observance

Four moments of silence during the morning of Sept. 11 will mark the beginning of Alfred University's observance of the one-year anniversary of the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon. President Charles M. Edmondson has asked faculty, staff and students to observe a moment of silence at 8:46 a.m., the time when the first plane struck the World Trade Center; 9:03 a.m., the time of the second plane's impact; 9:59 a.m., the time when the first tower collapsed; and 10:29 a.m., when the second tower fell. The bells in Alfred University's carillon will toll at 10:29 a.m., in concert with bells at every other school, college and university, as requested by Gov. George Pataki. A candlelight procession will be held that evening, beginning at 8:30 p.m. in the area just above the Miller Performing Arts Center. Marchers will proceed to the King Alfred statue in the center of campus for brief remarks by community leaders. Residents of the surrounding area are invited to join the campus community for the candle light procession and ceremony.#####
