### Update on Inbound Campus Telephone Issues

The campus telephone system is still experiencing intermittent issues with inbound calls that may cause callers to get messages to the effect of "The number you have reached is no longer in service or has been disconnected" when attempting to call into an AU office telephone.

Troubleshooting of these issues has been multifaceted and now includes coordination between ITS, our phone service provider FLTG, and the FCC.

FCC is involved due to the fact that resolution of these issues will likely require support from hundreds of regional long distance carriers.

\*Approximate date/time of the call.

\*Phone number from which the call originated.

\*Destination phone number on campus.

\*The message the caller received and whether the call was able to be completed if retried.

### New Policy for Summer Motor Pool Use

Due to the increased demand for exclusive, long-term use of fleet vehicles during the summer months, it has become necessary to revisit the current operating procedures to ensure we are able to most effectively serve the needs of the campus community. With currently more than 75% of the vehicles being reserved for the entire summer, the ability to support normal university travel requests and maintain the fleet of vehicles is compromised. Most of these vehicles reserved for the entire summer travel very few miles and the payback does not cover the maintenance on the vehicles during this
