On Sunday, Nov. 1, the Music Department will present a sequel to last year's very successful Organ Spectacular. The program will feature the AU Brass Choir, its director and trumpet soloist Dr. Chris Foster, and organist Laurel Buckwalter performing some spectacular literature including Aaron Copland's "Fanfare for the Common Man" for brass and percussion and Marcel Dupre's "Poeme Heroique" for brass, organ and field drum.

Organ solos include J. S. Bach's Toccata and Fugue in D Minor, arguably his most famous organ piece, and a Calvin Taylor arrangement of the spiritual "Soon I Will Be Done".
