This computer SCAM starts with a pop-up window saying that your computer has been infected and you should call a phone number to fix the problem. This is a SCAM. Once they get you on the phone they will try to remote into your computer. When you allow them remote access, they can put anything on your computer and possibly steal passwords to your bank records and/or charge card purchases.

If you see this pop-up, please reboot your computer without calling them. Once you reboot the pop-up should go away and not return. However, If you have called the number and have allowed them to remote in, please take your computer off the network immediately and call us for further instruction. 607-871-2222.

If this is your personal computer, please call your service provider ASAP.
