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Student Print Management Coming in Fall Semester 2011

To better prevent waste and foster greater environmental awareness on campus, ITS will implement Student Print Management beginning in Fall semester 2011.

ITS is currently gathering data about student printing to determine an appropriate student print quota. At the end of spring semester a committee (composed of students and faculty) will recommend a print quota.

In the Fall semester 2011, students will be able to print the number of allotted pages, after which they will be able to buy additional printed pages through a secure Web page that is linked to their accounts. The cost per page will be 3 cents (for both single-sided and duplex printing).
