### NatualizeNY: Lottery will provide vouchers for free citizenship

Governor Cuomo's Office for New Americans has launched its second round of NaturalizeNY assisting New Yorkers with the path to citizenship. As a result, New York State will lottery off 1,500 vouchers that cover the cost of applying for U.S. citizenship (worth \$725) as well as all associated legal services. The initiative is called NaturalizeNY < http://www.NaturalizeNY.o...> < http://www.NaturalizeNY.o...>.

The lottery is free to enter and open to all citizenship-eligible legal permanent residents (green card holders) residing in New York State who meet certain income requirements. This means that you do not have to be a SUNY affiliate to apply for the lottery. Anyone who meets the eligibility requirements can also register and win.
