The following appeared in the most recent WAGE Project Newsletter:

Trained Facilitators Conduct First \$tart \$mart Workshop of the Season

Facilitators Amy Jacobson and Jill Crandall conducted a \$tart \$mart workshop for students at Alfred University on Tuesday September 17, 2008. Sponsored by the campus Women's Leadership Center and Career Development Center, the training is the first of what will be twice-yearly \$tart \$mart offerings at Alfred. Interest in the pay gap and salary negotiation skyrocketed on Alfred's campus after a spring 2007 visit from Evelyn Murphy, and an AAUW-sponsored documentary project about the pay gap called Dreams to Reality. \$tart \$mart also counts toward the requirements of a new Leadership Certificate Program at Alfred. Facilitators Amy and Jill were pleased by the high level of interaction during the training. Most participants had personal stories to share, and were glad to receive concrete tips for how to approach these situations in the future. The three male participants were equally engaged, and appreciated hearing real-life examples of how men encounter and can redress the pay gap.

WAGE commends Alfred University for its leadership in preparing its graduating students to earn what they are worth. Especially in these tense economic times, this initiative on the part of the University is both timely and exceptional.
