Did you know that you can see your paystub by Wednesday afternoon of a Payroll week in Bannerweb?

- 1. Log into Bannerweb
- 2. Click on the Employee Tab
- 3. Click on Pay Information
- 4. Click on Pay Stub
- 5. Select Year, Click Display

You will then be able to view any paystubs for that year and have printable access to them at any time! If you feel there is an issue with your pay, you should report the issue to Payroll immediately.

You can also view your direct deposit allocation, earnings history, deductions history, and earnings by position on the Pay Information tab.
