Clinton/Obama Campaign Talk

Two-time Emmy-winning CNN correspondent Mary Cardaras will lead an Alfred University audience through the back door of media coverage in the Clinton/Obama race during a lecture and questions-and-answer session, at 6 p.m., Monday, Feb. 18, in Nevins Theatre, Powell Campus Center on the AU campus. The program is open to the public free of charge.

Cardaras, a Boston-based political scientist and chairman of digital media and communications at The New England Institute of Art, will lecture on "From Hillary's Tears to the Obama Mystique: How media coverage shapes our perceptions and vote."
