Internet Connection Concerns

ITS is aware that the available Internet bandwidth has become saturated and that students are having great difficulty connecting to resources off campus. As a result, we are fast-tracking the deployment of a new server that will allocate bandwidth in a highly efficient manner.

We do not believe that this will entirely solve our issues, but we believe that it will somewhat alleviate the problem.

For the last 18 months, Alfred University has been working with ION (Independent Optical Network) which is currently building a state-wide network that will bring new and great connectivity to All of Western New York, including Alfred University. We anticipate that ION will be online and providing service to Alfred University sometime in December or January. This new connectivity will triple our current bandwidth and provide a much better environment for cost-effective broadband in the coming decades.

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Student Print Management This Semester

To better prevent waste and foster greater environmental awareness on campus, ITS will implement Student Print Management beginning fall semester 2011.

Through the print management program, undergraduate students will be able to print 350 pages and graduate students will be able to print 800 pages/semester. After students have exceeded their print limits, they will be able to buy additional printed pages through a secure Web page that is linked to their Banner student accounts. The cost per page will be 3 cents (for both single-sided and duplex printing).

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Former AU Engineering Professor Dies

Robert L. Snyder, a member of the Alfred University faculty for 26 years, died Thursday, Sept. 1, 2011, in Atlanta, GA, after a long battle with cancer. Snyder was 70 and at the time of his death was a professor and co-chair of the School of Materials Science and Engineering at Georgia Tech.

While he left Alfred University in 1996, Snyder never truly "left" Alfred; he retained his ties to the faculty, to his former students, and to the University itself. "Bob Snyder was truly a legendary figure whose sense of humor was exceeded only by his scientific prowess," said AU President Charles M. Edmondson. "I often asked Bob for guidance, and he never failed to offer it in terms that were clear, humane, and wise. Alfred has lost a dear friend."
