# **Carillon Recital for Universal Peace Day**

On Tuesday, Aug. 5, Alfred University Carillonneur Laurel Buckwalter will join the bells of the Davis

Memorial Carillon on campus to bells around the world to Ring Bells for Peace and A World Without War on Universal Peace Day, a program of the NYC Peace Museum.

At 7:15 p.m. EDT, the exact moment of the Hiroshima bombing, bells worldwide will take part in A Peal for Peace. The largest bell of the AU carillon (3,850 pounds) will be swung for five minutes. Any guests who would like to assist in the swinging of the bell are welcome. Please meet Buckwalter on the second floor of the carillon at 7:10 p.m.

The public is invited to attend this free event, to be followed by a recital performed by Buckwalter.

Last year, A Peal for Peace bell ringing ceremonies took place around the world in Japan, New Zealand, Australia, Mexico, Georgia (Eastern Europe), and throughout the United States including nine churches in New York City. This year marks the 69th anniversary of the United States' dropping of the first atomic bomb on Hiroshima.

Following this year's peal, there will be a minute of silence for Prayers for Peace, then Buckwalter will play a recital of pieces appropriate for the theme of peace, including the John Lennon song "Imagine," "In Memoriam" by John Courter, "Haru no Umi" ("The Sea in Spring") written by Michio Miyagi for koto and shakuhachi, "Dona Nobis Pacem," and others.
