Tuesday Carillon Recital

On July 25 at 7:00 pm, the third Wingate Summer Carillon recital will be performed by Janet Tebbel of Philadelphia. Janet is the carillonneur for two carillons in the historic Germantown section of the city. She studied at Eastman and the Belgian Carillon School and has performed throughout the US and Europe. Her program has four sections: Joyful Music, Let's Dance, Hymn Preludes and For the Young (and Everyone) and includes carillon originals, two tangos and a samba, and songs from the Muppet Movie.

The Wingate Summer Series honors the first university carillonneur, Dr. Ray Wingate, professor of organ, who served as carillonneur from the arrival of the bells in 1937 until his death in 1968. The series is generously funded by the Margaret Merrill and Ray Winthrop Wingate Memorial Carillon Foundation. This summer's series is dedicated to Margaret Wingate Rase (1919-2016), president of the Foundation for 49 years.

Alice Zhang is the Grand Prize Winner of 2017 "Young Pianist Competition" a

Fifteen year old Alice Zhang from Vernon Hills, Illinois, is the 2017 "Young Pianist Competition" Grand Prize Winner announced at the MostArts Festival Gala Concert, Saturday night. Alice Zhang will receive a \$10,000 cash prize, an invitation to become a Young Steinway Artist, and will return to Alfred University for the opening Gala Concert at the 2018 MostArts Festival next July.

Fifteen year old Raymond Feng from Pittsford, New York took the \$5000 second prize.

Seventeen year old Scarlett Zheng of Cranford, New Jersey was awarded 3rd prize and \$1500, as well as the Audience Favorite Award for her moving performance of the Mozart Piano Concerto No. 20.

The festival's youngest competitor, thirteen year old Aliya Alsafa of Chicago, Illinois, also won Friday evening's Audience Favorite award for her beautiful performance of the Mozart Piano Concerto No. 15.

In addition to these prizes, the Judges Discretionary Award of \$1,000 went to two sixteen year olds Siyu Yang of Syosset, New York and William Yang of Lexington, Massachusettes, for their brilliant solo recital performances. Other Merit Certificates were award to seventeen year old David Godar of Cincinnati, Ohio and Christian Chiu from Pittsburg, Pennsylvania.

The International jurors for the "Young Pianist Competition" included Angelin Chang, Steinway artist and German born pianist, Andreas Klein and American pianist, Anthony Pattin.

Closing remarks were offered by the President of Alfred University, Mark Zupan, who presented the University's Fiat Lux Award to Lisa Lantz
