

## **Professor elected Fellow of Gerontological Society**

Dr. Robert J. Maiden, professor of psychology and director of Alfred University's Gerontology Program, was elected a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America, a Society devoted to research, practice, and education in aging, at the Society's annual meeting this summer. A member of the Alfred University faculty since 1982, Maiden has been a licensed psychologist since 1983, and a consulting psychologist since 1984. In 1982, he joined the courtesy staff at Jones Memorial Hospital in Wellsville. In 1992, he also became an approved evaluator of substance abuse and alcoholism for the Department of Motor Vehicles in the State of New York. He was elected to the Society because of his "dedication, outstanding achievement, and exemplary contributions to the field of gerontology." Maiden received a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Michigan in 1969. He was on the graduate faculty for the New School for Social Research in New York, New York from 1972-1974, while earning his M.A. in Developmental Psychology and a Ph.D. in clinical psychology.
