

June Art Walk features guided tours, artisan display during Alfred University Reunion

ALFRED, NY – The June Art Walk, scheduled Saturday, June 9, in Alfred will include guided tours of several venues in Alfred and on the Alfred University campus.

Several locations in nearby Alfred Station, Andover and Wellsville will also be included in the June Art Walk, which is being held during Alfred University Reunion Weekend and will include an on-campus artisan display.

The June Art Walk will be held from 1-3 p.m. June 9. The guided tours begin at the Alfred Ceramic Art Museum front entrance and will take participants on tours to the following 10 venues.

Alfred Ceramic Art Museum: Cristina Córdova: JUNGLA; Mysteries of Place: Selected Prints from the Institute of Electronic Arts, New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University, featuring Elisabeth Pellathy, Lee Somers, and Scott Stephens. These exhibitions are set to run through July 29.

Alfred Art Park, 3 N. Main St., Alfred: Featured sculptures by Alfred University alumni J. Fischer, Hannah Hones and Calvin Hubbard, who earned BFA degrees in 2018, and Jeremy Entwistle, who earned a BFA degree in 1998; and Glenn Zwegardt, Alfred University professor of sculpture, emeritus, and his apprentice, Lucas Jankovsky. The Alfred Art Park is a group project involving property owners John and Chelly Ninos, and Zwegardt and Coral Penelope Lambert, Alfred University sculpture dimensional studies professor. This is the third year the space on Main Street has been used to highlight sculpture made by past and present students and faculty from the Alfred University School of Art and Design.
