Other events Friday include a screening of the film, "The Producers," at 8 and 11 p.m. in Nevins Theater, Powell Campus Center, AU campus; a production of the play, "Sex on Stage," at 8 p.m. in CD Smith Theater; a performance by the Malcolm Palmer Band at 9 p.m. in the Terra Cotta Coffeehouse, Main Street, at 9 p.m.; and a performance by comedian Pete Dominick at 10 p.m. in the Knight Club, Powell Campus Center. Festivities for Saturday, April 22, begin with the "Fun Bun Run" at 10 a.m., beginning at the Main Street bandstand. The Hot Dog Day Parade through Main Street will follow at noon. Throughout the day Saturday, numerous activities are planned for downtown. From noon to 5 p.m., there will be a street carnival, children's games, live music, and an arts and crafts fair. Food - including, of course, hot dogs will be available throughout the day.
