## Non-statutory early retirement options

Non-statutory employees, upon meeting certain age and service criteria, may be eligible to participate in one of the University's Early Retirement Plans. There are several options available to employees who meet certain requirements.

The basic option is the Standard Retirement Program, which allows for retirement at age 65. One of the most popular plans, retirement at age 62, states that employees are eligible to enroll at the beginning of the fiscal year (July 1 through June 30) in which they turn age 56. There are also options available that are specific to faculty.
