ITS has negotiated with Spectrum to bring a new streaming TV service called SpectrumU to the Alfred University campus. Environmental Journalists Present at AU

Alfred University's Communication Studies department will present a discussion (online via Zoom) about reporting environmental issues as part of its Environmental Journalism class. Members of the Alfred University community are invited to the discussion, which will feature four guests with extensive experience in environmental journalism.

- Alan Adelson television/film producer, director, and writer. Alan is releasing a documentary about a decades-long struggle for environmental justice that airs this fall on PBS in the United States and on television networks in Germany and France. He is the director and writer of films like Lodz Ghetto (1998), Sequel to Lodz Ghetto (1992) and In Bed with Ulysses (2012).
- Kate Taverna television/film director and editor. Kate has partnered with Alan Adelson to produce the environmental documentary that will be released shortly. She has 31 credits as a film editor, including documentaries like She's Beautiful When She's Angry (2014), which examines the history of "outrageous, often brilliant women who founded the modern women's movement", and Pray the Devil Back to Hell, the story of a group of women who helped bring peace to Liberia and elevate to power the country's first female head of state.
- Sharon Lerner investigative reporter with The Intercept. Her series The Teflon Toxin was a finalist for a National Magazine Award. Her work has appeared in numerous publications, including the New York Times, The Nation, and the Washington Post.
- Carol Van Strum author and environmental activist. In 2018, Carol was awarded the international David Brower Lifetime Achievement Award for outstanding environmental and social justice work. She is the author of A Bitter Fog, which tells the story of the fight she helped lead against use of Agent Orange and other herbicides. That fight led to a nation-wide ban on the aerial spraying of pesticides in all U.S. federal forests.
