District Attorney says Klein's death 'not homicide' 4/26/02

A campus-wide memo issued this morning by President Charles M. Edmondson: Just yesterday I told you that we had received no further information for several weeks regarding the death of Benjamin Klein. However, we learned this morning that the medical examiner's report has been released to the District Attorney's office. In a press release issued this morning, District Attorney Terry Parker ruled out homicide as the cause of death. He indicated, however, that the investigation continues and that charges may be brought in the assault that Ben allegedly suffered prior to his death. We will continue to cooperate fully with the authorities in this matter. The statement from the District Attorney does not answer all the questions relating to Ben's death, but I hope that it puts an end to some of the rumors and speculation surrounding this tragic incident. KleinThe investigation into the death of Alfred University student Benjamin P.Klein, age 21, of Pultney, VT, has been continuing since the body of the student was found in Canacadea Creek on February 12th of this year. The final autopsy report in the February death of Benjamin Klein in Alfred, NYhas been received by the authorities investigating the circumstances of hisdeath. The report has been shared with family members. Based upon the findings of the Medical Examiner, the death of BenjaminKlein is determined to be not a homicide. The conclusions in the report doconfirm that Mr. Klein was the victim of an assault prior to his death, buthis death cannot be directly attributed to the assault. Therefore, nocharges relating to his death are contemplated or warranted at this time. The police investigation into crimes which occurred prior to Mr. Klein'sdeath is continuing, however, and it is anticipated that criminal chargeswill be filed when the investigation has been completed. No further comment can be made on the status of the investigation at this time. The investigation continues to be jointly conducted by the Alfred PoliceDepartment and New York State Police, including the Violent CrimeInvestigation Team, Allegany county Sheriff's Office and the AlleganyCounty
