GENERAL COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY INFORMATION:

- * All approved graduating students and students on the walk-list through the University Registrar's Office, will each be allotted five tickets for attendance to the annual Commencement Ceremony.
- * Faculty, members of the graduating class, and all other staff partaking in the ceremony will not need a ticket.
- * Tickets will be available starting Monday, April 22 - Friday, May 17, 2019 for approved graduates in the Powell Campus Bookstore on the second floor of the Powell Campus Center.
- * Those requesting additional tickets have the option of being placed on a list. On May 13, prior to the Commencement Ceremony, a review of any remaining tickets will be conducted and those tickets will be divided and distributed evenly amongst the requests. Placement on this list is not a guarantee of additional tickets.
- * Students and guests may park in any valid parking spot the day of the ceremony. Shuttles, starting at 8:00 am until 1:30 pm, will be running from several locations to assist you with getting to the McLane Center and returning to your vehicles.
- * Guest seating opens at 8:30 am. Please arrive early to locate parking and be seated prior to the start of the ceremony at 10 am.
- * Any person occupying a seat must present a ticket for admittance. There is no standing room area in the McLane Center for guests without tickets.
- * For those without tickets, an overflow area will be available in Holmes Auditorium, Harder Hall, where a live streaming video of Commencement will play.
- * A live stream video of Commencement will be available on the Alfred University website.
- * Children under the age of 3 years old who will sit in a lap during the entire ceremony do not require a ticket. Please note, due to strict fire regulations, strollers and car seats may not be taken into the McLane Center.
- * Guests with disabilities: seating on the floor (rather than bleachers) is available and guests may enter at the lower level of the McLane Center. We encourage you to make prior arrangements with Bonnie Dungan, Director of Summer and Parent Programs at dunganbj@alfred.edu or (607) 871-2612 should you require special assistance.
- * Cell phones and other electronic equipment must be turned off or muted.
- * Due to fire regulations, guests are not permitted in the aisles during the ceremony at any time.

 - b. Do not forget to select if the recipient is an employee or not an employee (if the student receives any payroll from AU they are considered a "student employee")
 - c. If the student is an "employee," the check amount will be the award less taxes regardless of the amount of the award or the intent of the award
 - d. If the student is not an "employee," the award will be reviewed by financial aid to see if the recipient is able to receive a cash payment or if the award will need to be applied against their outstanding loan balances.
 - e. As a non-employee student, if cash is allowable, the business office will issue the check for the full amount of the award. The student is responsible for declaring the award on their taxes for 2019. If total awards received by a student in a calendar year equal or exceed \$600, the student will receive a 1099 tax form from the Business Office at the end of the calendar year for tax purposes
 - e. Complete the description and reason for award and date presenting award
 - f. All forms to be delivered to Human Resources, Greene Hall by Monday, April 18 for processing in time for Awards Presentation

 - a. Complete all sections of the form including student address
 - b. Do not forget to enter account number (FOAP) and amount of the award
 - c. Explain details of award and date presenting award

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HSK Test on AU Campus

Here come the HSK tests!

CIAU (Confucius Institute at Alfred University) will be organizing HSK test this Sunday, April 14 in Perlman Hall right after the Mock tests this Wednesday.

The HSK is an international standardized exam that tests and rates Chinese language proficiency. It assesses non-native Chinese speakers' abilities in using the Chinese language in their daily, academic and professional lives. HSK consists of six levels.

The results of the test can serve several purposes:

1. A method for Chinese language learners to assess and improve their proficiency in Chinese.
2. A reference for employers' decision-making concerning the recruitment, training and promotion worldwide.

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New Major and Minor in Healthcare Planning and Management

In recent years the growth in the healthcare industry has outpaced growth in almost all other industrial sectors. Specifically, healthcare management positions are expected to grow by more than 20% over the next ten years. This significant growth is a result of healthcare becoming the largest employer in the US and that the majority of employment growth is not in clinical positions but rather administrative and management positions. In addition, five of the ten jobs that will see the fastest growth in the next decade are in healthcare and elderly assistance signaling continued opportunities in healthcare management.

The College of Business at Alfred University has recently announced that both the undergraduate major and minor degrees in healthcare planning and management as well as a concentration in healthcare in the MBA program are now being offered.

This fall HLPM 301 and MBA 603 Health Care Policy will be offered. Taking this course will give you an opportunity to learn more about business careers in the healthcare industry.
