

Bridges sets new Alfred University men's soccer standard for career assists

ALFRED With two assists in the Alfred University men's soccer team's 12-0 victory at Cazenovia Tuesday, Sept. 4, senior midfielder Jon Bridges (Topeka, KS/Topeka) established a new school record for career assists. The two assists gave Bridges 24 for his career, eclipsing the mark of 23 held by former Saxon standout Scott Miller from 1992-95. In two games this season, Bridges has scored six points (2G, 2A) and has a shot at breaking the school's all-time scoring record held by Nino Legeza, who scored 74 points on 32 goals and 10 assists between 1992-95. With 14 games remaining in the season, Bridges has 56 points (16G, 24A). Bridges is a two-time Empire Eight First Team All-Star and last season was named a National Soccer Coaches Association of America/Adidas Regional All-American.
