		2:00 Lessons Learned for Online Teaching

All employees, whether scheduled to work from campus or remotely, are required to do a daily on-line screening for COVID -19 Symptoms. The daily screening is required for all weekdays, defined as Monday through Friday, regardless of whether you are scheduled to work on or off campus. Completing the daily screening is not required on Saturday and Sunday unless you are scheduled to work on either of the two weekend days or will be coming to the campus for some other reason. If you are scheduled to work from the campus you must do the screening prior to coming to campus. If you are not scheduled to come to the campus, the screening should still be completed each day by 10:00 a.m. If you work an afternoon or evening schedule you will be able to enter your screenings between noon and 2:00 p.m. for a separate list.

Under New York State order, the University is required to record the responses and to keep a record of all screenings. If you have further questions regarding the daily screening please call the Human Resources Department or email quinan@alfred.edu or misner@alfred.edu for direction.

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Faculty Enrollment In MFA (October 2020)

In Spring semester 2019, ITS enrolled all students in email Multifactor Authentication (MFA)...and followed up by enrolling all non-faculty employees in MFA in Fall semester 2019.

This coming Fall semester (Mid-October 2020), we will enroll all Alfred University faculty in email Multifactor Authentication.

Multifactor Authentication (MFA) is a significant deterrent to unauthorized email access...even when the password has been compromised. MFA is often described as "Something you know, and something you own." The something you know is the password portion ...and in our particular case, something you own will be a mobile device.

During the enrollment process in mid-October, faculty will be redirected to a Web page that will require them to register a mobile number where they can receive a call, text or notification to a phone based authenticator application (perhaps the easiest method of MFA). The enrollment process will take only a few minutes and will require that the employee have their mobile phones available on the day of enrollment. After they have registered that phone, they will be sent a call, text message or authenticator application notification whenever they login from off-campus. If an employee is oncampus, there will be no need for an additional authentication (other than the password).

The entire process is similar to the way banks secure login attempts to online financial sites. If you would like to complete the process before October 2020, please feel free to pre-enroll at: https://my.alfred.edu/inf....

Matt Katz has been teaching at Alfred University since 2002. In 2015, because of family events he switched to teaching exclusively in online or hybrid formats, when he had to depart living in Alfred. Although coerced by life events, the change allowed for him to evolve his teaching practice. He was able to craft a curriculum for a subject that was seeming incompatible with online leaning (Glaze Chemistry), that is not just embraced by his students, but changes the educational discourse in his field.

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HR Tip of the Month

Did you know that if you are a regular full time or part time employee of AU that you have Bereavement time available to you immediately after hire?

Up to five paid days of Bereavement Leave are provided to allow the employee to mourn and otherwise attend to the death of an immediate family member. Immediate family members are defined to include: spouse or spousal equivalent; child, stepchild, or grandchild; grandparent or parent; sibling; or parent-, son-, daughter- or sibling-in-law.

One work day of Bereavement Leave is provided to allow the employee to mourn the death of a cousin, aunt, uncle, niece or nephew.

(For CSEA Union Members, please check your Union handbook)

Time awarded for Bereavement Leave will be pro-rated for regular employees who work less than full-time.

Bereavement should be recorded on the timesheet as excused time with a comment in the comments section. If you normally work 7 hours a day, you put 7 hours under excused time for the days that you missed. If the days that you missed surpass what is allotted, you will code that time as vacation/personal/floating holiday/merit time.
