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## Change in e-mail begins Aug. 15

We have had a good response to Alfred Today, and it has cut the number of miscellaneous e-mails across campus. After Tuesday, Aug. 15, 2006, Alfred Today will be the primary method of distributing campus-wide e-mails. Access to the Exchange distribution lists for announcements of an immediate nature will be only available through college Deans and Vice Presidents, as well as a few other directors who manage campus safety, security, and telecommunications.

The Executive Council realizes that this will initially inconvenience a number of faculty/staff and divisions who have relied on mass e-mail as a form of communication, and we have charged ITS with the task of exploring alternative campus-wide communication technologies. In the fall, ITS will also offer several workshops on alternatives to mass e-mail. In the meantime, if you have a particular communication need, please contact the Helpdesk and staff will try to help find a resource to meet your needs.
