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Universal Design for Learning (UDL) Workshop

Universal Design for Learning (UDL) involves the process of creating learning experiences that are appropriate for all students, regardless of learning or circumstantial differences. This live, virtual workshop will be facilitated by AU's Universal Design Task Force. It will cover UDL guidelines and strategies that faculty can incorporate into their online (and in-person) teaching. Faculty will be asked to reflect on the needs of their students and their teaching practices. The workshop will include discussion of potential challenges posed by a variety of learning and circumstantial differences. Faculty will be asked to think about their learning objectives, and consider specific UDL strategies as they plan for the fall semester. Participants will also collaborate and brainstorm to develop new strategies they can use in their courses in order to better serve the needs of all students.

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New Toshiba Multi-Function Devices being deployed now!

We are in the process of deploying a new fleet of leased multi-function printing devices across campus. These machines will fully meet if not exceed our needs and result in significant savings for the institution while adding several new features.

PaperCut for All

As a part of the deployment, we are adding PaperCut to every device on the MPS lease, a feature currently used by students on the public access printers. This will provide flexibility to securely print/scan from any Toshiba MPS device on campus. Fobs will be distributed over the next several days via inter-office mail; however, an AU username and password can be used in the meantime to print.

XMedius Fax

XMedius will allow individuals to send and receive faxes from your computer. Training on this feature will be available soon.

Managed Print Services

Non-MPS devices (desktop printers) will bear a Toshiba sticker with the Alfred University logo at the top, indicating that your device has been added to the program. As a networked printer, Toshiba will monitor the toner levels remotely and send supplies for the device(s) automatically, eliminating the need for departments to order toner/ink cartridges. Any issues with the devices should be reported to the ITS Helpdesk who will schedule any maintenance/repairs needed. If a desktop printer in your area does not have a sticker as described above, please reach out to **procurement@alfred.edu** and we will help resolve the issue.

PrintReleaf

The PrintReleaf program plants trees in targeted reforestation areas based on the print activity of the devices. As part of the redeployment, the University will be added to Toshiba's global program.

He was able to craft a curriculum for a subject that was seeming incompatible with online leaning (Glaze Chemistry), that is not just embraced by his students, but changes the educational discourse in his field.
