AU professor directs USUK International Iron Symposium 7/21/08

Coral Lambert, assistant professor of sculpture/dimensional studies at Alfred University, was the director of the ninth USUK (United States United Kingdom) International Iron Symposium in June 2008. It took place at Butley Mills Studios, on the east coast of England in Suffolk, near Orford Castle, about one hour from London. Sixteen artists from four countries participated: the United States, Wales, the United Kingdom, and Ireland. The focus of the USUK is to provide a platform for artists to explore and push the boundaries of the cast iron medium in contemporary sculpture. Lambert attended the International Research Fellow/Artist University of Minnesota, MI, from 1995-98, after she received her master of fine arts degree in sculpture from Manchester Metropolitan University in England. She received her bachelor of fine arts degree from Central School of Art, London.
