The AU Math Club will host Dr. Joseph Petrillo of AU's Division of Mathematics who will present, "Making Music with Mathematics."

Abstract. In the early 1900s, Austrian/American composer Arnold Schoenberg (1874-1951) devised an atonal method of musical composition called the 12-tone technique. We will introduce this technique and discuss how modular arithmetic plays a fundamental role in its use.
