The conference organizer is responsible for scheduling the room that will be used for the meeting.

If ITS assistance is requested, the video conference should be held during AU business hours, which are 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. ITS has a limited number of staff to provide assistance, and cannot guarantee service for meetings held before or after AU business hours. Assistance requests will be honored on a first come, first served basis and will depend on technician availability. If a technician is requested, please allow 15 minutes for setup and testing.

All arrangements, including room reservations and assistance requests must be made seven (7) business days prior to the meeting date. Requests that are made less than seven (7) business days before the video conference may not be honored.
