A recital at 8 p.m. on Sat., Oct. 1, in the Miller Theater, Alfred University, will feature Christopher Foster and two Allegheny College faculty members -- Jennifer Dearden, trumpet, and Alec Chien, piano. The recital is free and open to the public.

Dearden and Foster will perform both solo and duo trumpet works. Chien will provide piano accompaniment.

Dearden's solo works will be F.J. Haydn's Concerto for Trumpet in Eb Major and Joseph Turrin's Caprice. Foster's solo works will be Richard Peaslee's Nightsongs and Eric Ewazen's Sonata for Trumpet and Piano.

Nazi Holocaust Course and Tour

The Nazi Holocaust:

If you have interest in either Nazi Germany or the Holocaust, please note that an information session will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 4 at 9 p.m. in Kanakadea Hall to publicize a two-week, faculty-led tour of Europe in May 2012.

The trip will conclude a 2-credit Spring course called The Nazi Holocaust which will examine one of the most brutal episodes of modern history.

IMPORTANT: YOU NEED NOT ENROLL IN THE COURSE TO JOIN THE TOUR. The trip is open to all AU faculty, staff, students, and alumni.

The trip is a 14-day tour of Central and Eastern Europe, to include visits to Berlin, Warsaw, Krakow, and Prague. It will involve stops at Buchenwald and Auschwitz, two of the most notorious concentration camps. However, the tour will also provide an opportunity to see other European sites, some related to World War II, as well as free time in each of these cities.
