Speaker: William Carty Topic: "Color in Ceramic Glazes: A Happy Accident"

Highly prized 12th century Celadon glazes are a luxurious pale green. This color, however, was not a result of an added colorant, but due to the interaction of a clear glaze with a body that contained iron. What research has uncovered is that the firing schedules for these ceramic pieces were much longer than modern firing cycles - up to four days compared to the three hours commonly used today.

This lecture will also give a brief summary of the modern routes used to obtain color in ceramic glazes
