2015 Fall "Walking Works" Program Results

Alfred University's 2015 Fall "Walking Works" Program ended 11/8/15.

70 participants (12 teams) comprised of faculty and staff members logged an impressive 23,537,143 Steps (11,768.57 Miles) over the 6-week program!

The winning team logging 2,656,762 Steps (1,328.38 miles) was the "WalkInn" team comprised of Kristen Karl, Theresa Woodworth, Megan Ryan, Carole French, Sharon Meinking, and Marty Fuller.

The top individual walker of the 6-week program was Cheryl Tucker of "The Christopher Walkens" team, logging 724,432 Steps (362.22 Miles).

Other walkers each logging 600,000+ Steps were Robin Mazejka (346.21 Miles), Marty Fuller (332.19 Miles), Jeff Danaher (331.85 Miles), Mariann Walsh (315.45 Miles), and Rosalie Mulhollen (300.25 Miles).
