The Hornell Art Walk will be an exciting exhibition of work by more than 50 artists throughout downtown Hornell and Shawmut Park. It will take place Saturday May 3 , 2014 from 5 to 9 p.m.

The Hornell Art Walk is a collaboration between Alfred University's Space and Place class (which has been working in Hornell since January), other students and faculty of AU's Sculpture/ Dimensional Studies Division, the City of Hornell, and artists and organizations working in Hornell.
