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Vacation accrual reminder

We are nearing the end of our first year of benefit accrual. One of the positives to the new accrual system is allowing the employee to manage their own benefit time, no use it or lose it to deal with at the end of each year. However, the employee needs to plan according to how they desire to use their vacation time.

There will only be one more year of allowing a negative balance (up to the amount earned in a year). Starting July 1, 2008, only available benefit time can be used. If one were planning a vacation for late summer of 2008, they would need to manage how many days they have available going into 2008 and what their plans for time off are between now and then. An employee would be unable to use all of this year's accrual, take several weeks early in 2008, and still have enough time available late summer for time off.

Please think about your vacation plans for the rest of this year, and how you may need to manage your time to accommodate next year's vacation. If you have questions, please feel free to contact Human Resources.
