## Megan Parry and Mei-ling Hom at Cohen Gallery

Work by mixed media artists Mei-ling Hom and Megan Parry will be featured in the first exhibition of 2020 at the Cohen Gallery.

The exhibition will feature paintings, drawings and prints. An opening reception is scheduled for Thursday, Jan. 9, from 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm; and will remain on view through Jan. 31.

Statement: "Often times when art exhibitions feature paired artists there is the assumption that these artists share conceptual or stylistic groundings. Shared approaches do exist (i.e. biological motifs, making work that makes itself, patterning, finding elegance in restraint) but the genesis of this exhibition grew out of a friendship with the notion that respect for each other will support mutual artistic growth."

Hom, an artist based in Philadelphia and Andover, NY, earned a M.F.A. degree in sculpture from Alfred University's School of Art and Design in 1987. She has garnered numerous prestigious awards including the Pew Fellowship in Visual Arts, a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship, and a Fulbright Research Fellowship to South Korea (2007. She has had major site installation exhibitions at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Institute of Contemporary Art in Philadelphia, and the Sackler Gallery of the Smithsonian Institution.

Parry, whose work has been featured nationally, was born in Hornell, NY, and grew up in Philadelphia. She is the daughter the late Dr. William Parry '47, longtime professor of ceramic art in the Alfred University School, of Art and Design and a 1947 Alfred University graduate. Her career encompasses public and private commissions from Alaska to New York City, with many exhibitions in and around Boulder, CO, where she lived from 1970 to 1989, and in the Detroit, MI, area from 1990 to 2018. Parry returned to Alfred with her husband, film scholar and English professor Lesley Brill, in 2018.

Nydia Gutierrez was born in Venezuela and is currently based in Medell n, Colombia, South America. Gutierrez is an architect from the Pontifical Xavierian University (Pontificia Universidad Javeriana) in Bogot , Colombia. She is also a museologist from the JKF University in San Francisco, U.S. She is the former Chief Curator of painting and sculpture at the Museum of Fine Arts in Caracas, Venezuela. She teaches in the Master program of Museology at the National University of Bogot , Colombia. Gutierrez just recently retired as the Chief Curator of the Museum of Antioquia, Medellin, Colombia. One of her many publications is The Vulnerable Individual: Assessment of Psychoanalytic Notions in the work of Miguel ngel Rojas.\*

\*Miguel ngel Rojas is a Colombian conceptual artist born in Bogot in 1946. His work includes drawing, painting, photography, installations and video and is often related to the sexuality, the marginal culture, the violence and problems involved with drug consumption and production.

Waylande Gregory is recognized as America's top ceramic artist of the 1930s.
