Nevins Theater - What You Need to Know about Using Technology!

Here is a list of considerations to make if you intend on holding programming in Nevins Theater. We appreciate your cooperation.

- * You will need to bring a computer with you if you plan on projecting onto the screen for the audience to see. We do not keep any laptops in Nevins, but faculty/staff should be able to acquire one from ITS Equipment Lending (x3009) on the 3rd floor of Perlman Hall.

- * Requests for technical support will be accepted up to one week prior to your engagement. This will not guarantee support, but we will do our best to provide such. These requests can be directed to Craig at caa2@alfred.edu. Support will often be offered by student staff members. In the absence of available support, you may be asked to provide someone to be trained on Nevins technology to assist with your event.

- * You should be familiar and able to operate any computer you bring with you. Different systems have different mechanisms that control display and our support person may not be able to quickly assist with your particular machine. We simply ask that you investigate how to project the display from the machine you are using so that you will be comfortable doing so for your presentation. This includes making sure that you are comfortable running PowerPoint (or any other software you intend on using) with limited or no assistance.

- * Mac users: If you plan on using an Apple computer, please bring the appropriate Display to VGA adapter. Again, we do not keep any of these in the theater. ITS Equipment Lending may be able to help with adapters, but not a guarantee with the wide range of adapters that exist for different models.

- * Audio projection is accessible for videos or other sound bites you may want to play during your presentation. Please plan to play the audio files from your computer.

- * There is wireless and wired Internet connection in Nevins Theater. If you plan on using YouTube or any other streaming website, I recommend that you plan on using our wired connection.

- * You will have access to a wired podium microphone and a wireless lavalier microphone for your event. If you need more than one wired microphone, please let us know at least one week before your event by contacting Craig at caa2@alfred.edu. We can only offer the one wireless lavalier

microphone; there are no other wireless options.

* We no longer support VHS. If you plan on playing film, please arrange to play a DVD from a computer on stage or from the DVD player in the booth.

* Nevins Theater is not a classroom and we do not plan on providing support unless properly requested. If you need Nevins for continuous use, please make an appointment with Craig by emailing caa2@alfred.edu to be trained to use the equipment.
