Melissa spent two years working for a Japanese material supplier, Tokyo Ohka Kogyo, in the fast-paced semiconductor industry before opting for a position at a smaller company. She now works as a sales engineer for a Swedish laser manufacturer (Cobolt) and is responsible for all research and university activities in the U.S., with an emphasis on Raman spectroscopy and optogenetics.
