She told students it is crucial to "stick with it" during those first years on the job.Senior accounting major Danielle Sandy said she learned "this is just the beginning. Where we start now is going to launch our careers in many different directions, and each experience that we have will build off of the previous ones." She continued, "Everything we learn, and all of the challenges we face, will bring us that next step closer to our career goals. We need to take it all in, one experience at a time, because we are laying the foundation for our futures."Although Muhleisen's interests relate mostly to accounting majors, her message is valuable for every student on the Alfred University campus.
