Rogers and they came to Rockport, Mo, where he had charge of the schools of that place In 1875 he moved to this city, where he had charge of the school for 2 years; then 2 years at North Platte; then came here again to the school and during that time he, with Mr. J. Burdick, bought out the grocery business of D: C. Stratton, which they an till the big fire in 1881. Afterward, with W W. Price, he opended a hardware store in the building now occupied by A. B. Edee, till he sold out and went to Withita county, Kas, and located a soldier's claim which he proved up on and returned to Pawnee and began beaching again. He carried \$2,000 life insurance in the A.O.U.W., of which order he was a member. The three children born to him, Jessie M., Lila II. and Lucy O, were all at home to help their mother care for him during his last illness.

The funeral was held from the family home Sunday afternoon, services being conducted by Rev. Whitman. Interment was had in Pawnee City

cemetery.
