Open Enrollment for Statutory Employees

This is a reminder that the open enrollment period from Oct. 28 through Nov. 10, 2012 applies to all regular Statutory employees as well. Contributory Life, Voluntary Accident, Vision and Flex Spending plans are provided by Alfred University, not the State, so if you wish to add or make changes to any of these, requests need to be made during this period and will be effective Jan. 1, 2013.

Remember, Flexible Spending Accounts must be re-affirmed even if you do not wish to make a change from 2012 levels.

The State has not announced the Open Enrollment dates or the new rates for the Health Plans yet. When the choices and 2013 premiums are available, the open enrollment dates for the Statutory Health plans will be announced.

Stefan Krten (born 1963) is a painter and musician who lives and works in Dsseldorf. He studied at the Kunstakademie Dsseldorf, where he was in the class of Michael Buthe (1944-94). Krten later studied and taught at the Art Institute of San Francisco.

In 2007, "Shadowtime," a survey of his paintings since 2001, was shown at Museum Haus Esters, Krefeld and the Royal Hibernian Academy, Dublin. His paintings are included in the permanent collections of several European institutions as well as the Museum of Modern Art, New York, the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art and the Montreal Museum of Art. In 2011, he was the subject of a solo exhibition "Rainbows in the Dark" at Cosar HMT, Dsseldorf. Five of his paintings were included in "Gesamtkunstwerk, New Art From Germany" at the Saatchi Gallery, London in the spring of 2012.

Krten is represented by Alexander and Bonin in New York City.
