Woughter has served as a six-year member of the board of directors of the Wellsville Area Chamber of Commerce, including a two-year term as its president, and is currently the AU representative to the Hornell Chamber of Commerce. She is also active on the Health Impact Council for the Allegany County United Way. She and her husband Bob, also an alumnus of Geneseo and Alfred, are the parents of two teen-age sons, Zach and Dan.
