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Class Opportunity: Concepts of Service Learning

If you're looking for a 3-credit elective course, consider taking UNIV 115 Concepts of Service Learning.

This course combines weekly class meetings with weekly service hours spent in the local community in an exploration of what it means to be engaged in service learning as a way of accomplishing and demonstrating civic engagement.

Each student selects a service project to satisfy the main requirement of at least 4 hours of service work per week. The class meets together 1 hour per week to discuss assigned readings and each other's reflections, written and oral. This semester's primary service partner will be the newly elected Mayor of Alfred, and we'll be focusing on town-gown service projects.

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Arthur L. and Lea R. Powell Distinguished Lecture in Psychology

Dr. Frank Farley, psychologist and L.H. Carnell Professor at Temple University, Philadelphia, will deliver the 2013 Arthur and Lea R. Powell Distinguished Lecture in Psychology. The lecture will be presented in Nevins Theater (in the Powell Campus Center) Friday, April 26 at 10 a.m.

The lecture is open to the public and free of charge, though registration is required.

The lecture is entitled "EXTREME PEOPLE - Seeking a Common Thread Among Risk-takers, Heroes, Leaders, Innovators, Entrepreneurs, Thrill Seekers, Delinquents, and More."

Dr. Farley will discuss the nature of risk-taking, both positive and negative, including heroism, creativity, and other topics. He will suggest how various kinds of risk-taking behavior may be linked, as well as their role in child and adolescent development.

Dr. Farley asserts that to understand American society requires an understanding of how risk-taking qualities underlie its enormous creativity on the one hand, and its high-crime rate on the other. He will make recommendations for delinquency and violence reduction, education, healthy child-rearing and family practices, the happy life, and more.

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Mary Jemison: Attend a Program on This Inspiring Early American Woman

Join the Baker's Bridge Historical Association of Alfred Station for its next program on Monday, April 15. Speakers Bill Heaney and Kay Bennett will present a program on Mary Jemison.

Jemison's legacy and history are fascinating and worth knowing. Kidnapped at age 15 by the Seneca Indians during the French and Indian War, Mary was eventually adopted and accepted by the Native Americans as one of their own; she became known as the "White Woman of the Genesee." Her story and longhouse are on prominent display at Letchworth State Park where she is buried.

The meeting, held at the Association's Meeting House on Hamilton Hill Road, begins at 7:30 p.m. with a short business meeting preceding the program. The event is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be served afterward.
